On the recommendation of Britt Rosencutter, on behalf of Fleet Management and Sheriff's Office, Randy Bargdill moved to **accept the low bid from Don Hattan Chevrolet in the amount of \$59,400.00 and establish contract pricing for labor and parts at the rates listed above for three (3) years.** Ellen House seconded the motion. The vote passed three to one with Tim Myers abstaining from the vote.

These vans are used to transport inmates to and from various facilities by Sheriff's staff. The Chevrolet Express 3500 15 Passenger Full Size vans were requested due to the custom built partitions and window bars, which will be transferred from the previous van to the new ones. Last year, these two (2) vans drove an average of 57,906 miles per vehicle.

Neither van meets the 15 point criteria required for vehicle replacement. However, due to high mileage and because they are transporting inmates throughout the state, these vehicles need to be dependable.

Vehicles being replaced:

3944 2017 Chevrolet CCG3706 185,564 miles 1GAZGNFGXH1155299 Points - 12.9
3945 2017 Chevrolet CCG3706 195,124 miles 1GAZGNFGOH1160432 Points - 14.8

These are replacement vehicles for the Sheriff's Office. Surplus will be sold on Purple Wave, Inc.

Questions and Answers

Russell Leeds: Are there any recusals at this time?

Tim Myers: I do, Tim Myers.

Russell Leeds: At this time do we have any questions from the Board? I just wanted clarification on this particular vehicle obviously there will be a warranty with it, but then do we take this to a dealer, in this case Don Hattan Chevrolet, would they do the maintenance on this vehicle opposed to our fleet?

Penny Poland: No, any work that would be done in house is done by fleet technicians.

Russell Leeds: Okay, so what is the pricing on labor and parts?

Penny Poland: That is in the event if we have to take it to the vendor for big engine repair, transmission work, and things like that.

Russell Leeds: Okay, but all routine maintenance will be done through normal procedures?

Penny Poland: That is correct.

Russell Leeds: Is it common for us to replace this particular part of our fleet more frequently because of the fact that they're transporting detainees and they're traveling long distance on a regular basis?

Penny Poland: Yes, it's the mileage.

Russell Leeds: It because an officer's safety as well as a prisoner's safety, I would assume?

Penny Poland: Yes, sir.
