- 1. Microphone in the Courtroom:
  - Small footprint (removing the need to have microphones at each location at all times)
  - Must have the ability to implement an additional microphone during such times as is needed.
  - Clear recording of hearings
  - Clear re-broadcast of sound to speakers located in the Courtroom without feedback.
  - Microphone must be able to send sound to video conferencing software (Cisco Webex, ZOOM, etc.) and social media platform (YouTube).

2. Cameras in the Courtroom:

- View of entire "Well" area of the Courtroom. Video must pick up the Judge, Witness, and Counsel Tables. Cameras must not record the Jury Box or as much of the Gallery as possible.
- Cameras must be able to display feed to video conferencing software (Cisco Webex, ZOOM, etc.) and social media platform (YouTube).
- Can the Cameras be controlled individually? For example, Can one Camera be turned off to run one feed only if needed?
- Can the Camera have the ability to cut the feed on a moment's notice from the control box?
- Can the Cameras supply a video feed without the use of video conferencing software or social media platform?

3. Speakers located in each Courtroom:

- Sound to playback from the Microphone within the Courtroom.
- Sound to broadcast any remote video conference so Courtroom can hear remote party. Is this possible?
- 4. Evidence Displays within selected Courtrooms:
  - Display evidence during trials.
  - Ability to turn off individual screens by Judge.
  - Ability for Judge's monitor to view evidence first, this is to ensure that any video displayed is appropriate for other parties to view and is allowable on the public record.
  - The ability of the Attorney Counsel Tables to display through technology to the Evidence Displays with the Judge having the ability to turn off screens if necessary.
  - Remote evidence display through the use of a tablet or mobile device? Can this technology connect to the system?

5. Control system within the Courtroom:

- Control the microphone within the Courtroom. Mute.
- Control the Cameras in the Courtroom. Stop the display of the video if needed.
- Control the video feed to the Evidence Displays within each Courtroom. Turn off displays or only display to certain screens during evidence trials.
- Control the Projector screen within the Courtroom. Up and down control.
- Control the Sound within each Courtroom. (Mute, Pink Noise, etc.).
