On the recommendation of Josh Lauber, on behalf of Public Works, Anna Meyerhoff moved to **accept the low bid from Cornejo & Sons LLC in the amount of \$3,973,094.32**. Jennifer Blasi seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Sedgwick County Project 2021 Nova Chip (R175-B) will result in ultra-thin bonded asphalt surfacing and pavement markings on approximately 62 miles of roadway in Sedgwick County. Nova Chip is an ultra-thin bonded asphalt overlay of approximately 5/8" placed over a heavy asphalt emulsion membrane. A spray paver places both components in a single pass sealing small cracks and ensuring adhesion to the underlying pavement. Nova Chip provides a durable friction resistant surface on an existing flexible pavement that is effective on high speed roadways with minor to moderate cracking and can correct minor surface irregularities.

Lynn Packer: This is Lynn Packer, Deputy Director for Public Works.

Josh Lauber: Can you help fill in the gaps for me Lynn?

Lynn Packer: As far as the description of what Nova Chip is?

Lynn Packer: Nova Chip provides a durable friction resistant surface on an existing flexible pavement that is effective on high speed roadways with minor to moderate cracking and can correct minor surface irregularities.

Russell Leeds: This is a standard annual maintenance method that we have used in the past, and we continue to use because we have found it to be effective is that correct?

Lynn Packer: That is correct.

On the recommendation of Josh Lauber, on on behalf of the Regional Forensic Science Center, Anna Meyerhoff moved to **accept the quote from NicheVision Forensics, LLC in the amount of \$72,415.00 for a contract period of four (4) years.** Tim Myers seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Sedgwick County’s forensic DNA laboratory continues to experience an increase in demand for “touch” DNA analysis of items where a limited amount of DNA is present and where the detection of multiple contributors is expected.

Over the last five (5) years, the FBI’s DNA Advisory Board, the European Network of Forensic Science Institutes, the Scientific Working Group for DNA Analysis Methods, and the United States Department of Justice have all recommended the use of probabilistic genotyping methods for the interpretation of mixture profiles.

In order to stay abreast with the technical advances in forensic DNA analysis, the forensic DNA laboratory purchased STRmix probabilistic genotyping software. The RFSC has leveraged a substantial amount of grant funding to purchase the STRmix software, to provide users with training, and to obtain technical support required for validation studies. The software is critical in the evaluation of DNA profiles and the information derived from the software is used for DNA reporting and court testimony.

NicheVision Forensics, LLC is the exclusive US distributor for the STRmix probabilistic genotyping system and support and continuity of operations depends on ongoing upgrades and maintenance.

Originally brought to Bid Board February 11, 2021. Original request was for five (5) years and has now been changed to four (4) years.

**Questions and Answers**

Anna Meyerhoff: What was the reason for reducing the terms on the contract or the length of term?

Shelly Steadman: The maintenance for 2021 was due. A solution was to create an addendum to the existing agreement, which has been signed by the vendor and is on the tail end of being approved through our county system. We were taking care of the 2021 through 2022 maintenance immediately then we will proceed with the contract for the other four (4) years.

Russell Leads: Can you identify yourself for the record?

Shelly Steadman: Shelly Steadman, I am the Director of the Regional Forensic Science Center.

Tim Myers: With changing that to a four (4) year contract, will we see any price change from year to year?

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Shelly Steadman: This is interesting because this is a grant funded purchase. I initially asked for five (5) years because they reduced the cost annually if you buy five (5) years up front. I have since learned that Purchasing does not allow for such things beyond the year the service is provided. So unfortunately we are not getting that discount and will in fact pay 4% more from the year prior, each year going forward. I did have to get a different quote. We knew that when we came before you last time so the prices should not be different.

Joe Thomas: Didn't it have to do with the grant funding amounts were not issued? It had to do with the money actually being available?

Kirk Sponsel: It is my understanding there was an issue with Finance just in terms of the grant money becoming available. That's why there were limitations.

Joe Thomas: That's why they wouldn't allow it to be done. I just want to correct that it was not so much Purchasing as it is a Finance requirement. That is the only correction I want to make, not contradicting just clarifying.

Kirk Sponsel: Mr. Bargdill you have indicated that you are not discussing this particular purchase. Are you recusing yourself?

Randy Bargdill: I am.

Kirk Sponsel: What is your basis for that?

Randy Bargdill: I oversee the tag offices.

Russell Leeds: Your title?

Randy Bargdill: Chief Deputy Treasurer.

Kirk Sponsel: Just so we can cover ourselves, was this the lowest bid?

Britt Rosecutter: It was not the lowest bid price but it was the highest scoring from the committee.

Kirk Sponsel: Could you indicate what factors were considered in your evaluation?

Joe Thomas: Keep in mind, this was a proposal.

Kirk Sponsel: Right.

Britt Rosecutter: The scoring criteria, the first is Qualifications experience, capabilities and technical competence. The breadth and depth of the proposer's organization's experience in the performance of comparable services was fully developed and presented. References were considered as part of this evaluation item as well as employee retention. That was given 50 points. The second is demonstrate clearly and completely your organization's ability and capacity to meet the all Request for Proposal Conditions and respond to all instructions as outlined herein. That was given 20 points. The pricing and service rates was the third, it was given 20 points also. The last is implementation of schedule. The proposed start up schedule appears reasonably relative to the requirements in the Scope of Work and the quality and thoroughness of the work proposed. That was 10 points, for a total of 100 points that we go by.

Kirk Sponsel: Thank you and as a RFP that was the best value selection. That is based upon objective criteria related to price, features, functions, life cycle costs and other factors. Based on that, I do feel comfortable proceeding, thank you.

They are used in road right of ways, grinding patching of asphalt roads, working on the driveway approaches with rock and hot mix asphalt, cleaning ditches, installing culverts, cleaning out bridges and culverts, picking up tree limbs, and taking out trees when needed. They are also used to work on drainage problems on creeks and rivers around the county as well as loading materials at the area yards to be delivered to job sites. They have also been used to remove debris in the event of a disaster such as a tornado or flooding.

Jim Weber also provided specific information below as to why Public Works are requesting replacement of the two (2) that do not meet the 15 point requirement.

Over the last few years we had extensive discussions with the BoCC about replacing our cold mix asphalt plant. In 2020, the county decided to move to the use of commercially produced hot mix asphalt for road overlay and major repairs. To set up for installation of this material, the county purchased an asphalt paver which has recently been received and will go in to service this year. The recycler/mixer machines (1802 and 1809) were important pieces of equipment in our old cold mix asphalt process. They are of no use for any process that we currently use. We have requested they be traded out in the fleet for a pair of skid steer loaders. The loaders are very useful for hot mix patching as well as grinding high spots, edges and transitions. We also use them for ditch work, culvert cleaning and installation, moving raw materials, and our scrub sealing process. The low points given for these machines that are 25 and 35 years old simply underscores that they had limited (but critical) usage with our cold mix operation.

State of Kansas awarded the contract to nine (9) vendors.

Russell Leeds: Who do we have online for this item?

Britt Rosencutter: Penny Poland with Fleet and John Medlam with Public Works.

Jim Weber: Actually it's Jim Weber with Public Works.

Russell Leeds: Jim, would you like to speak to the two (2) skid loaders that do not match the 15 point value?

Jim Weber: Sure. We have some equipment we are not using. We used them in our cold mix operations, which you recall we got out of that business. They are 25 to 35 years old so technically they are low points because they are low usage. They are of no use to us now. With the hot mix operation, we would be better off converting these over to skid steer loaders. If we don't do it then these pieces of equipment will just sit in the yard and rot. We are trying to convert them into something useful.

Russell Leeds: These pieces of equipment will be disposed of through Purple Wave or some other means of sale?

Jim Weber: Yes. They can go on the market, we do not need to wait for the new ones show up, they can start rolling over.

Russell Leeds: Just for clarification Jim, we have a White Star dealer in town, is that correct?

Jim Weber: Yes. That is where they will come from.

Russell Leeds: Even though it is coming from the state contract, we have a local that we deal with.

Purchasing comment: Yes.
