"Some of these may have been answered already and if so let me know how to look it up. 1) Did Sedgwick County reach out to Zuckerbergs organization (Center for Tech and Civic Life) or did they reach out to Sedgwick County? 2) When was the approval to accept the funding for the elections and was there a vote to accept, or was a single person responsible for the decision? 3) Can we see a breakdown of how ALL the ~ 850,000 the county received from Zuckerbergs organization was spent?
