The following is to ensure that vendors have complete information prior to submitting a proposal. Here are some clarifications regarding the proposal for Sedgwick County Developmental Disability Organization (SCDDO) Intellectual and Development Disability Programs (State Aid).

Questions and/or statements of clarification are in **bold** font and answers to specific questions are *italicized*.

- 1. We have several program ideas in mind that tie well to the priorities. Can we make one (1) proposal that addresses all of the components or would separate proposals be required for each variation?**

*Answer: How you respond to the RFP is an agency decision. Either method is acceptable.*

- 2. The transition to work states up to age 22. If we would have some other 20-somethings who are not working and possibly not in a day program, could they participate as well i.e. could we bump the cap to 25 or 28?**

*Answer: No. The SCDDO grant can only pay for transition to work services for individuals up to age 22. A program could serve older individuals but the SCDDO transition to work funds must be limited to individuals 22 or younger.*

- 3. Would costs associated with food, activities, and transportation be allowed under attendant care?**


*Answer: Yes.*

4. **Do those participating in programs need to be already deemed eligible for IDD services? Those with a case manager typically have funding (FSD or HCBS) to help with camp costs and other supports, but there is a large number who are in special educational classes who have not yet applied or are in the process who do not have funding supports.**

*Answer: Yes individuals must be determined eligible, per the RFP "Grant projects must exclusively serve individuals determined eligible for the IDD service system, with the only exception being infant/toddler subsidy programs which include screening components designed to identify whether the child might have an IDD."*

Firms interested in submitting a proposal *must* respond with complete information and **deliver on or before 1:45 pm CDT, Tuesday, April 27, 2021**. Late proposals will not be accepted and will not receive consideration for final award.
