Linda Kizzire: I am trying to comprehend how EH Technical is so much cheaper per month than the others for Household Hazardous Waste. The others range from \$400.00 to \$724.00 and they are coming in at \$45.00 a month?

Britt Rosencutter: I did call him and asked him specifically if he quoted that properly. He said yes it was quoted properly.

Russell Leeds: My assumption that the score 88.50 was the high score out of all of those proposals?

Britt Rosencutter: Yes.

Russell Leeds: It appears that EH Technical, as far as the annual cost without any additional add-ons, comes in about \$900.00 less than the next closest bid. Then they go up from there, on that level it appears to be the general average annual cost. There is pricing for different things that vary across the proposals?

On the recommendation of Joe Thomas, on behalf of Emergency Communications, Tim Myers moved to accept the change order to extend the contract with Mission Critical Partners, LLC through December 31, 2022. Linda Kizzire seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

In 2019, a request for proposal for Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) Consultant Services resulted in a contract to hire a consultant to help guide the county through the procurement and implementation of a new CAD system. This consultant assisted in the evaluation of vendors, vendor selection, contract negotiation, implementation, and post-cutover support. The CAD system is a critical component to the public safety system, and is key to providing accurate dispatching services, records and analytics to the 31 agencies dispatched by Sedgwick County Emergency Communications.

Purchasing recommends that Emergency Communications continues to use this provider to complete the project which lost a year due to the COVID pandemic.

Anticipated spend is \$61,761.00 to fulfill the contract duration.

Questions and Answers

Russell Leeds: Do we have anyone on the line for this?

Elora Forshee: Yes.

Russell Leeds: Elora, this is a continuation of an ongoing contract with this company, can you give a brief view of where we are in the implementation process with this company?

Elora Forshee: Yes, we are at the point now in this project where we have selected a vendor for our CAD/RMS/JMS which are all three (3) together. Mission Critical Partners is helping us through the implentation and build-out of the system. We are used to the system we have now; most of us have only worked in this. Even the previous version of Northrup Grumman which is our current CAD provider, that is all we have known because that is all that we have had for several decades. They are helping us answer questions about creating efficiencies and points of concern from Tyler, our new vendor. They are proving to be invaluable in this process. Right now we are set up to go-live in May 2022 with the new system. Mission Critical Partners will provide advisement through go-live and punch list items in the months to follow. Opening this up for another two (2) year contract provides us breathing room to get through this.

Russell Leeds: This is funded through the 911 fund, it is not through the general fund?

Elora Forshee: Yes, correct.
