Access to Vaccine

Do you want the COVID-19 vaccine but don't have your own vehicle to get to a clinic? Please read the information below for options in Sedgwick County.

Bus Routes

Wichita Transit offers affordable bus fares. For more information on bus routes, please check their website at

- The standard fare is \$1.75.
- Exact fares are required for every bus ride.
- Inbound buses travel toward downtown, and outbound buses travel away from downtown.

Cycling

Ride your bike. Alternatively, "Bike Share ICT" offers more than 100 bikes in the downtown Wichita area. Download the Zagster app to find a location. Bicycle rental is around \$3 per hour.

Transportation for Rural Residents or Residents with Disabilities

A variety of transportation options are available to eligible individuals. Riders requesting transportation assistance must be in the following categories: older adults or an individual's representative, persons with disabilities or the general public living in rural areas.

If you live in Bel Aire, Derby, Furley, Goddard, Haysville, Kechi, Maize, Mulvane (Sedgwick County only), Park City or Valley Center – obtain an application by calling (316) 660-5150 or 1-800-367-7298 or download the [Mill Levy transportation application](#).

If you live in Andale, Bentley, Cheney, Clearwater, Colwich, Garden Plain, Mount Hope, Peck, City of Sedgwick, Viola or unincorporated areas of Sedgwick County – download the [rural transportation application](#).

If you live inside the Wichita city limits, you may be eligible for Paratransit van (316-352-4828) or Wichita Transit bus (316-265-7221) services for the disabled.

Cab Service

Pay for a cab ride to the clinic or contact your health insurance to see if you are eligible for a ride to and from a vaccination site.

Ride-Sharing Groups

Ride-sharing groups Uber and Lyft have you covered! From now until July 4, both companies offer no-cost rides for everyone to and from COVID-19 vaccination sites during the sites hours.

To take advantage of this no-cost service, follow these simple steps:

- For Uber –
 - Download the Uber app on your smartphone
 - Open the app and tap **Vaccine**
 - Tap **Get your free ride**
 - Find your vaccine location
 - Select your ride and go
- For Lyft –
 - Download the Lyft app on your smartphone
 - Open the app and tap **Get ride code** when the message about free COVID-19 vaccine rides pops up
 - Tap **Redeem your Lyft code**
 - Find your vaccine location
 - Select your Lyft and go

You can also use the Lyft service to arrange a ride for someone else like a parent or neighbor.

- Tap the search bar on the home screen of your Lyft app
- Tap the 'Me' button at the top of the next screen, then select 'Add rider' and follow the prompts
- Enter the pickup location and destination and let your ride recipient know the ride is on its way!
(The ride recipient must have their own Lyft account and will see the ride details in their Lyft app.)

Where Does the Sedgwick County Health Department (SCHD) Administer No-cost, Walk-in Vaccine?

- **Main Vaccine Clinic** at the former Wichita Public Library | 223 S. Main, Wichita, KS 67202
- **Mobile Clinics** are offered by SCHD staff
- **Partner Clinics** are offered by community partners and assisted by SCHD staff. Appointments preferred but walk-ins are welcome

SCHD offers the Pfizer and Johnson and Johnson (J&J) vaccine. The Pfizer vaccine is available to people age 12 and older; the J&J vaccine is available to people age 18 or older.
