

Are you wanting the COVID-19 vaccine but don't have a means of transportation to get to a clinic? Please read the information below on options in Sedgwick County.

Bus Routes

Wichita Transit offers affordable bus fares. For more information on bus routes, please check their website at

https://wichitatransit.org/Routes/Pages/default.aspx.

- The standard fare is \$1.75.
- Exact fares are required for every bus ride.
- Inbound buses travel toward downtown, and outbound buses travel away from downtown.

Cycling

"Bike Share ICT" offers more than 100 bikes in the downtown Wichita area. Download the Zagster app to find a location. Bicycle rental is around \$3 per hour.

Transportation for Older Adults or Disabled Residents

If you live outside Wichita city limits, or in a rural area in Sedgwick County, the Sedgwick County Department on Aging might be able to provide transportation. To obtain an application, call (316) 660-5150 or 1-800-367-7298, or download the Mill Levy transportation application for these following communities: Bel Aire, Derby, Furley, Goddard, Haysville, Kechi, Maize, Mulvane (Sedgwick Co only), Park City and Valley Center, Or download the Rural transportation application for these following communities: Andale, Bentley, Cheney, Clearwater, Colwich, Garden Plain, Mount Hope, Peck, City of Sedgwick and Viola. If you live inside the city limits, you might be eligible for Paratransit (van) services for the disabled. You can contact them at 316-352-4828 or Wichita Transit for bus information at 316-265-7221.

Ride-Sharing Groups

Ride-sharing groups Uber and Lyft have you covered! From May 24 to July 4, both companies will be offering free rides for everyone to and from COVID-19 vaccination sites.

To take advantage of this free service, follow these simple steps:

- For Uber
 - o Download the Uber app on your smartphone
 - o Open the app and tap Vaccine
 - o Tap Get your free ride
 - o Find your vaccine location
 - Select your ride and go
- For Lyft
 - o Download the Lyft app on your smartphone
 - Open the app and tap **Get ride code** when the message about free COVID-19 vaccine rides pops up
 - Tap Redeem your Lyft code
 - o Find your vaccine location
 - Select your Lyft and go

You can also use the Lyft service to arrange a ride for someone else like a parent or neighbor.

- Tap the search bar on the home screen of your Lyft app
- Tap the 'Me' button at the top of the next screen, then add 'Add rider' and follow the prompts.
- Enter the pickup location and destination and let your ride recipient know the ride is on its way!
 (The ride recipient must have their own Lyft account and will see the ride details in their Lyft app.)

Where does the SCHD administer vaccine?

We offer Pfizer and Johnson and Johnson (J&J) vaccine. The Pfizer vaccine is available to people age 5 and older; the Johnson and Johnson vaccine is available to people age 18 or older.

The Health Department offers the following no cost vaccine clinic options:

- Main Vaccine Clinic at the former Wichita Public Library |
 223 S. Main, Wichita, KS 67202 | This clinic is a first come, first serve (walk-in) basis. No appointment necessary.
- Mobile Clinics are offered by SCHD staff and continue to be open on a first come, first serve (walk-in) basis. No appointment necessary.
- Partner clinics are offered by community partners and assisted by SCHD staff, by appointment only. Contact the host facility to make an appointment.
