

Make a Plan for your COVID-19 Vaccine

Follow these recommended steps when it is time to get your COVID-19 vaccine.

Step 1: Plan to receive your vaccine

- Go online at for more information at <u>www.sedgwickcounty.org</u>, or call (316) 660-1029 for assistance.
- Vaccine is first come, first serve (walk-in) basis. No appointment necessary at 223 S. Main during normal business hours.
- An individual's representative may assist to schedule appointments

Step 2: Gather your documents

- You will need to bring an ID, passport, birth certificate, or other proof of identification to your appointment
- Bring your Immunization Record Card for second dose appointments

Step 3: Prepare for your visit

- Arrange for transportation or support from others if you need assistance going to for your vaccine
- If you have questions about how the vaccine may interact with your medical condition and medications you take, contact your primary care physician before your vaccination

Step 4: Go to get your vaccine

- Look for the parking attendants if you are unsure of where to park at the vaccination clinic
- Please have the documents listed in Step 2 ready to share with staff at check-in

 Remember to wear a mask and keep six feet of space between you and others at the clinic

Step 5: After your vaccination

- Keep your immunization record in a safe place for your records
- Document any side effects from your vaccine using the V-safe After Vaccine Health Checker at https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/vaccines/safety/vsafe.html
- Continue to practice healthy behaviors including wearing a mask, washing your hands and keeping your distance

Step 5: Share your experience

- Take a selfie with your Band-Aid and share on social media using the hashtag #NotThrowingAwayMyShot, #ThisIsOurShot, or #StickItToCOVID, and tag Sedgwick County Government
- Continue to follow Sedgwick County online and on Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram
- Share your experience with others, and encourage others to become vaccinated too
