- During the month of February, Sedgwick County Developmental Disability Organization (SCDDO) Quality Assurance Staff completed 7 day and 17 residential program visits.
- The SCDDO hosted a meeting with area CDDO's to discuss the procedures and collaboration needed to serve individuals who access services across CDDO areas. Over the last few months, the SCDDO has become aware of a number of individuals who live outside Sedgwick County but are receiving intellectual/developmental disability (IDD) services inside Sedgwick County. Additionally, there are some individuals that live in Sedgwick County but are receiving IDD services outside Sedgwick County. While no CDDO wants to interfere with individuals' ability to making their own service choices, crossing the CDDO boundaries does raise quality assurance and capacity issues that necessitate collaboration between CDDO's. All CDDO's participating in the meeting agreed to work together to address the issues. The first step is identifying these individuals within our system. Participating CDDO's also agreed to share their memorandums of understanding currently used for these situations. CDDO's agreed to continue to meet to work out all the issues related to individuals crossing CDDO areas to access services.
- Director, Dee Nighswonger, provided legislative testimony in February to the Senate Ways & Means Human Services Subcommittee and House Social Services Budget Committee to advocate for KDADS budget enhancements to increase HCBS IDD Waiver provider rates to address the DSP workforce crisis and to increase CDDO administration funding.
