- During the month of April, Sedgwick County Developmental Disability Organization (SCDDO) Quality Assurance
   Staff completed 2 day program and 10 residential program visits.
- April 2<sup>nd</sup> was the final day for the SCDDO sponsored COVID vaccination clinics. We partnered with Heartland Homecare, a closed door pharmacy specializing in serving individuals with intellectual/developmental disabilities (IDD). ResCare was a gracious host site for the clinic which served individuals with IDD, their family and/or staff. A total of 114 individuals were vaccinated that day.
- International Autism Awareness Day was April 2<sup>nd</sup>. The following was shared via social media: "According to the World Health Organization, 1 in every 150 children has an Autism Spectrum Disorder worldwide. The Sedgwick County Developmental Disability Organization invites you to celebrate International Autism Awareness Day by:
  - O Shopping at Autism Avenue; a gift shop that also serves as an employment training ground for individuals with Autism.
  - Grabbing a drink at MOXI Junction; a coffee shop that employs individuals with intellectual/developmental disabilities."
- In April Contract negotiations with the Kansas Department on Aging and Disability Services (KDADS) for the annual participating CDDO contract began. Dee Nighswonger, SCDDO Directors, and Sherry Arbuckle, Service Access and Operations Director, serve on the contract negotiation committee. Some of the issues to be resolved include: 1) clarifying the population served which includes all individuals eligible for the IDD system, 2) discussing the parties to the contract and how the CDDO's interact with all five KDADS commissions but they are not all involved with the contract negotiations, 3) improvements needed to communication and sharing/use of information and data, 4) providing full reimbursement and funding to support CDDO activities and 5) exploiting technology to improve system efficiency.

- Work continues to further develop the DSP workforce development pipeline program. In April, HR professionals from Community Service Provider organizations from Sedgwick County and the InterHab membership were invited to participate in a T-Profile exercise facilitated by Naomi Boyer. The exercise helped develop the technical and 21<sup>st</sup> Century skill competencies desired in a Direct Support Professional. This is an important step in further developing the foundations for establishing a DSP Competency Framework to professionals the field.
- Jeannette Livingston, SCDDO Assistant Director, is participating on the Sedgwick County Health Equity Action
  Team (HEAT) to represent individuals with IDD as an underserved or vulnerable population. HEAT is working on
  identifying and implementing strategies for ensuring that COVID-19 testing reaches the people in our county
  who are underserved and have been historically excluded from community health efforts.
