- During the month of November, Sedgwick County Developmental Disability Organization (SCDDO) Quality Assurance Staff completed 3 day and 5 residential program visits.
- The SCDDO spent much of November trying to stay apprised of the numerous federal vaccine mandates and changes in COVID testing. Sedgwick County has some affiliates that would be covered under the federal contractor, OSHA large employer vaccine mandate and just a few affiliates could be impacted by the Centers for Medicaid/Medicare Services' vaccine mandate. As we were working to understand the various vaccine mandates, the Wichita State University MDL lab announced funding for free COVID tests was scheduled to end November 30th. The SCDDO worked with the Sedgwick County Health Department to host a meeting with an alternative COVID test provider (the Midwest Coordination Center). Currently, all federal vaccine mandates are on hold as the court determines the legal issues and funding has been reinstated for the WSU testing lab.
- November 3rd, SCDDO Director presented at the Educators Rising Conference hosted by USD259 for nearly 250 high school students in the southcentral area representing multiple districts that have been taking classes and have expressed interest in a career in education. Dee presented "Nothing About Us Without Us." The sessions were well attended and exceeded capacity limits. Additionally, SCDDO collaborated with WSU to host a booth to share information about the DSP Badge Courses throughout the day.
- The SCDDO has proposed the following items to the Board of County Commissioners to include on the Sedgwick County 2022 legislative platform:
 - > Develop a comprehensive five-year plan for the elimination of the HCBS IDD Waiver Waiting List.

- > Stabilize the Current IDD Service System & Reinforce Support for Local Expertise through Funding Increases. Add \$2.5 million (all funds) to KDADS budget for CDDO Administration. Increase HCBS IDD waiver rates by 7% (\$36.5 million all funds). Restore \$5 million in State General Fund and \$560,000 in State Aid to the KDADS budget.
- > Include \$5.0 million in the next budget cycle to specifically address IDD Waiver waiting list offers.
