- During the month of June, Sedgwick County Developmental Disability Organization (SCDDO) Quality Assurance Staff completed 4 day and 2 residential program visits.
- A big change happened at the SCDDO in June. The SCDDO Director, Dee Nighswonger, left June 3<sup>rd</sup> to become
  the new Regional Director for the Kansas Department of Children and Families (DCF). While we were all sad to
  see her go, we take comfort in knowing DCF will be in good hands and we expect positive changes for the
  systems DCF manages.
- June 9<sup>th</sup> the Sedgwick County Affiliate Directors met in-person for the first time since the beginning of the pandemic. It was great to see everyone but we also accomplished a lot of work. During this extended meeting, SCDDO management staff and the network of providers reviewed data on our performance during the pandemic. The group discussed what went well and what could have been improved. Additionally, immediate actions to be taken were identified. Based on this information, the SCDDO has changed the COVID reporting requirements and are exploring options for a collaborative communication site.
- The 2022 to 2025 Strategic plan was reviewed with SCDDO staff at the June All Staff meeting. You can find a

  the planning process, SCDDO staff identified four focus areas:

  - Leadership exercising leadership to make progress on complex system challenges
