- During the month of July, Sedgwick County Developmental Disability Organization (SCDDO) Quality Assurance Staff completed 8 day and 4 residential program visits.
- Jeannette Livingston, SCDDO Deputy Director, presented at the Project SEARCH conference the last week of July.
 The presentation was on the virtual reverse job fair created for the Sedgwick County Project SEARCH sites. The
 virtual reverse job fair for Project SEARCH began in 2021. Annually, it runs from April 1 to May 15. This year we
 had around 30 employers participate in the virtual reverse job fair and three interns achieved employment
 though the event.
- In July the Kansas Department on Aging and Disability Services (KDADS) began soliciting public comment on a proposed amendment to several Medicaid waivers, including the IDD Waiver. For the IDD Waiver, KDADS is looking to: standardize some performance measures, unbundle assistive services, require a provisional plan of care, authorize residential services for married couples, amend specialized medical care, allow virtual deliver of some services and allow paid family caregivers.
