

WHAT IS FENTANYL?

- A powerful, synthetic opioid that is 50 to 100 times more potent than morphine.
- Originally developed to help cancer patients manage their pain.
- Frequently mixed into other drugs such as heroin, cocaine, and even marijuana to increase their potency.
- Comes in a powder form, or in pills designed to look like prescription medication.

WHAT DOES FENTANYL DO TO THE BODY?

- Gives users a sense of euphoria.
- Too much can slow a person's breathing until they suffer brain damage, cardiac arrest, and death.
- Just 2 milligrams of fentanyl can be lethal.





HOW DO YOU TREAT A FENTANYL OVERDOSE?

Learn to recognize the signs of an overdose. These can include:



Slowed breathing



Cold and clammy skin



Blue colored lips and fingernails



Nausea



Dizziness



Drowsiness

Call 911 and administer Narcan if you have it.

Lay the person on their side to make it easier for them to breathe.
