I. Welcome, Announcements & Introductions-Brian Powers:

- a. Roll call of the meeting attendees
- b. Members introduced themselves and gave their goals for the WSCAAB

II. Meeting Minutes:

- a. Powers entertained a motion to approve the October 2021 meeting minutes
 - Ron Tracy moved to approve the minutes. Stacy Fuller seconded the motion.
 The motion passed unanimously

III. Committee Updates:

- a. Transit
 - i. Thomas Page noted the Transit app's update appears screen reader functional
 - ii. Gary Janzen spoke about the former bus stop at Town East
 - 1. He will reach out to Town East to facilitate discussion on this matter
 - iii. Brian Powers stated the City has offered to repave the parking lot in the past

- iv. Thomas Page noted that the NFB has done work on this in the past
- v. There might be an option of discussing a pedestrian path
 - 1. This would ensure that buses don't have to come close to the building
 - 2. Janzen recommended that he could start the conversation and have that initiated by next month's meeting
 - 3. He will give an update and there appears to be little doubt that there is support for this

- a. Discussion of Art Studio —Sarah Kephart, Envision Arts Program and Gallery Manager
 - The mission of the gallery is to empower artists and audiences that are impaired and disabled, and to provide them with a safe and supportive platform to not only exhibit but also engage the community
 - ii. The studio promotes a culture of health, wellness, and unity through inclusivity, diversity, equality, and accessibility to the arts for all
 - iii. The studio is located at 801 East Douglas at Union Station
- b. Discussion of Future Agenda Items
 - i. Thomas Page suggested discussion on construction site sidewalks
 - 1. These sidewalks push people into the streets
 - 2. Gary Janzen will provide information on these sidewalks and the permitting process during the next meeting
 - ii. Gary Janzen suggested discussion on Aira
 - 1. Aira stands for artificial intelligence remote assistance
 - 2. Individuals can utilize Aira to dial an agent and be provided navigational and visual support through facilities
 - 3. City and County have facilities where individuals have free Aira access
 - iii. WPD could elaborate on access points to services
 - iv. Harley Anderson mentioned uneven sidewalks in the Delano neighborhood
 - Gary Janzen explains how sidewalk maintenance is the responsibility of the adjacent property. The City investigates sidewalk based on citizen complaints
