

COVID-19 VACCINE DOSAGE SCHEDULE

The below table summarizes the schedule of when additional doses and booster doses can be administered for individuals who **do not** have a weakened immune system.

* mRNA COVID-19 vaccines are preferred over Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 Vaccine for both primary and booster doses; an mRNA COVID-19 must be used for the second booster dose

** Individuals should receive the Novavax booster if they have completed a primary series at least 6 months prior, have not received previous boosters, and cannot or will not get the bivalent booster.
