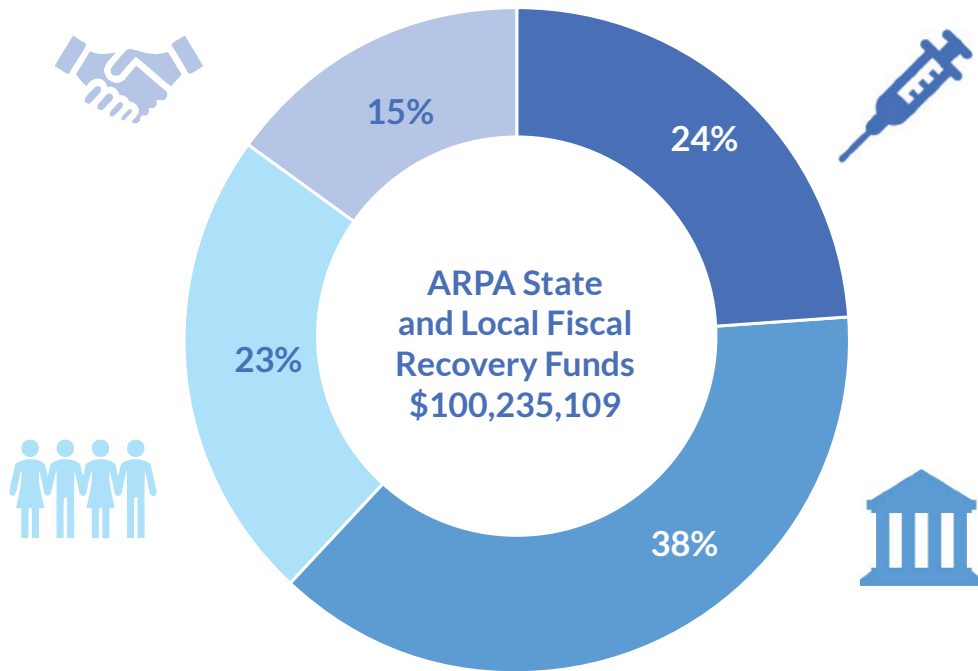




ARPA Funds at Work in the Community

as of November 30, 2022

Sedgwick County received **\$100,235,109** of State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds through ARPA to respond to the public health and economic impacts of the COVID pandemic.



The Sedgwick County Health Department conducted **90,836 COVID tests** and administered **289,359 doses of vaccine** at no cost to residents.



Currently there are over **4,711 cases in the judicial process, including 2,098 family law cases**. We have recognized that this is a community issue, and we have directed ARPA funds to address this.



More than 2,100 frontline workers received Premium Pay in recognition of the essential work they continue to perform in providing critical services to residents, including police, fire, emergency services, and public works.

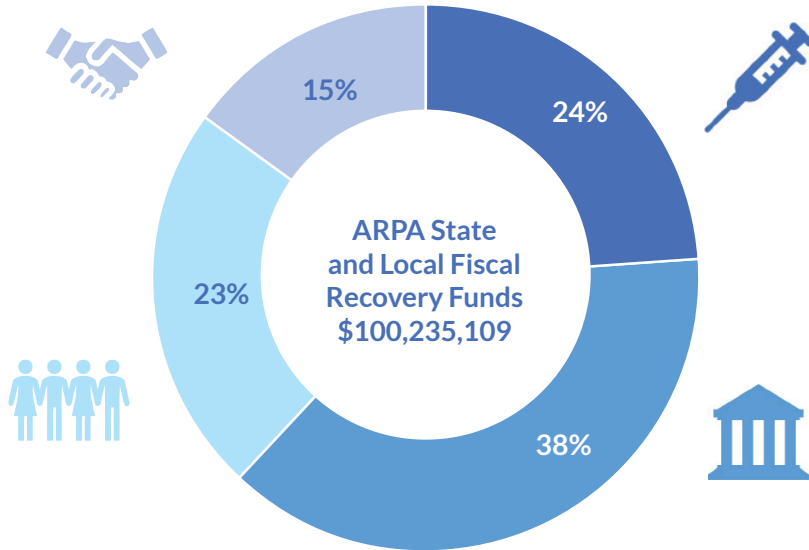


The County has partnered with WSU PPMC to provide Recovery Connect—a community navigator program that has already provided **referrals and resources to more than 686 residents in the first nine months**.
