These have 100,000 mile warranty on them. Once it gets out of warranty is when we are going to start to see what will impact our staff. I honestly don't think there is going to be a difference.

The study will review current service characteristics including: market demographics, customer satisfaction of current riders, map distribution of populations identified as significant transit users currently served, and the populations in need of transit services. A review of performance data of the current service model will be conducted: geographical area served, scheduling of rides, driver scheduling, vehicle fleet, technology, and communications.

An assessment of the efficiency of current operations to include hours of operation, geographic area served, and the operating model will be completed. The study will include comparison to similar transit programs across the country to identify best practices and technology opportunities for improvement/enhancement.

The consultant will make recommendations to the transportation program to increase efficiency, the reach of the program, the number of rides provided, and improve the overall operations. Based on the results of the study, recommendations for changes in technology, services, and operating model will be assessed. The detailed implementation plan will be finalized after the completion of the study.

On the recommendation of Jaimee Whitmer, on behalf of Division of Information Technology (DIT), Anna Meyerhoff-Cole moved to accept the quote from Cox Business at the rate listed above for a period of 60 months. Kenly Zehring seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

This circuit is one (1) of two (2) circuits that will support Sedgwick County's internet needs and provides internet to the internal county network, staff, and systems. Two (2) circuits are needed through two (2) providers, geographically separated, to provide redundancy should one experience issues, or the bandwidth needs exceed the availability of one (1) circuit. The internet circuit supplies the county's web presence, the websites such as sedgwickcounty.org, and also all remote connections for VPN connections including critical connections such as Sheriff, Fire, and EMS vehicles.
