- I. Introductions and Announcements – None

Due to not initially having a quorum, Action Items were tabled until later in the meeting.

- II. Coordination of Services (P.O.W.E.R.) Program, ATD (Alternative to Detention), IIP (Immediate Intervention Program) Presentation – Clary Cunningham, Kim Evangelista, and Alex Allbaugh delivered a presentation about the different programs offered to youth and their families and were available to address questions from the board. Included in the discussion, board members were informed about services offered to youth scoring low risk on the risk assessment tool.
- III. **ACTION ITEM: Approval of Team Justice Workgroup Minutes from the 4/7/23 Meeting. Kellie Hogan motioned, Sonya Miller seconded. There were no objections, the motion carried to approve the Team Justice Minutes from the 4/7/23 meeting, as submitted.**
- IV. Data and Program Updates – Mario Salinas reviewed data from February, March, and April and was available to address questions from the board.
- V. Juvenile Residential Facility/Alternatives to Detention Update– Stacy Bell provided updates regarding the Juvenile Residential Facility (JRF). Updates included that JRF will resume limited operations as of 5/8/23 after receiving re-licensing for up to 16 beds. The Evening Reporting Center (ERC) will continue to operate within the JRF facility and JRF residents will have an opportunity to participate in programming with ERC and Untamed Athletes several days per week. JRF will be available to both male and female clients, however, will only serve one gender at a time, starting with males. A total of 9 youth have currently been authorized for JRF and a staffing pool to address vacancies will be shared with the Juvenile Detention Facility (JDF). Stacy was available to address questions from the board.
- VI. Community Task Force Recommendations – Mario shared a dashboard showing progress towards the Community Task Force recommendations. Recommendations remaining in-progress include the implementation of Individual Justice Plans (IJPs) and audio within the Juvenile Intake and Assessment Center (JIAC). Mario shared that the Sedgwick County Department of Corrections (SCDOC) has contracted with a company to perform acoustic

testing within the facility so that a scope of work may be developed to aide in searching for a vendor. SCDOC has also entered into a 60 day free trial with AXON to explore the effectiveness of body cameras. Mario also shared that Steve Stonehouse recently attended a one year review of the Community Task Force on April 25th with the next meeting occurring in six months. Mario also discussed two different House Bills related to case lengths and risk assessments that would likely have a significant impact on corrections, if passed. Alex Allbaugh shared that no physical restraints have taken place during 2022 since the Juvenile Intake and Assessment Center (JIAC) Use of Force policy has been amended.
