WICHITA, KAN. – A para educator in Wichita has been sentenced to prison. Daniel Alonso-Hernandez, 34 of Wichita, admitted having sexual relations with two female high school students.

In September, Alonso-Hernandez pled guilty to unlawful sexual relations and aggravated indecent liberties with a child. He was a para at South High School at the time.

On Tuesday, District Judge Eric Williams followed the Kansas Sentencing Guidelines and sentenced Alonso-Hernandez to 77 months in prison.

This morning, Kenez Carter, 28 of Wichita, was sentenced to 175 months in prison in connection with a shooting death in Haysville on October 28, 2018. This happened during a private party in the 1900 block of Diedrich. Haysville Police found Jaylin Jacobs, 19 of Wichita, lying in the parking lot outside the club. He died a few moments later.

Carter told police he was at a party with a woman he considered to be like a sister to him and Jacobs had slapped her.

In October of 2022, Carter pled guilty to a charge of involuntary manslaughter. Today, District Judge David Kaufman sentenced Carter to 122 months and an additional 53 months for two earlier parole violations.
