

- 1. What were your expectations for this Steering Committee when the Commission first created it? Are we meeting those expectations? Why or why not?
- 2. Have you personally or has the Commission as a whole considered transitioning the Steering Committee to a Board of Trustees? Or even an elected Fire Board? Do you have any thoughts on the pros and cons of either model versus the one under which we're currently operating?
- 3. We understand you have been fairly vocal in your support of the notion of separating SCFD1 from the rest of county government. Could you talk to us a bit about your thoughts on this issue and whether the rest of the commissioners agree with your point of view?
- 4. Instead of separation, has the commission considered making changes to the organizational structure of county government such that Chief Williams would report directly to the commission as opposed to the Assistant City Manager? Do you believe that such a shift would necessitate the Fire Board becoming a separate entity (e.g., a Board of Trustees or elected entity)?
- 5. The Steering Committee was recently briefed on the Capital Improvement Project proposal regarding a new SCFD1 training center. Can you talk to us about your thoughts on that? Are you supportive or not and why?
- 6. Some of the Steering Committee members' terms will expire later this year. How did the Fire Board initially conceive of the term renewal process? On a related note, are there specific reasons why the Steering Committee was constructed with nine membership seats?
- 7. The Steering Committee remains very supportive of the Fire Board readopting PEERA and rerecognizing IAFF Local 2612, the official collective bargaining union representing the firefighters of SCFD1. Where does the Fire Board currently stand on this issue and why?

- 19-3612a. Establishment of district board of trustees; powers. (a) Whenever a fire district has been established under the provisions of K.S.A. 19-3601 through 19-3606, and amendments thereto, and the board of county commissioners determines, by resolution, that it is in the best interests of the county to place the supervision of such fire district under a fire district board of trustees, the board of county commissioners may appoint a board of trustees of not less than three members and not more than nine members, composed of persons other than the board of county commissioners, who shall serve at the pleasure of the commission. The board so established may be vested with all of the powers theretofore vested in the board of county commissioners, or such supervisory powers as the board of commissioners, by resolution, may delegate, and the board of trustees may exercise all powers so delegated.
- (b) Pursuant to an interlocal agreement entered into by the board of county commissioners and the governing bodies of cities and townships located within the fire district, the board of county commissioners may delegate its authority to appoint the members of the fire district board of trustees to a joint board appointed by the governing bodies of cities and townships located within the fire district. The fire district board of trustees appointed by such joint board shall be vested with all of those powers vested in the board of county commissioners under K.S.A. 19-3601 through 19-3606, and amendments thereto.

Any interlocal agreement entered into pursuant to this subsection shall be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 12-2901 et seq., and amendments thereto.
