IV. RFSC Performance Metrics and Center Updates - OD2A

Performance Metrics and Trends

- Medical Investigations
 - o 4,110 reported deaths for 2024
 - 1,481 reported deaths to date for 2025
 - Number of autopsies have decreased slightly from 2023 to 2024
 - Trending downward for 2025 based on the monthly averages
 - o 561 death scenes for 2024
 - 155 death scenes to date for 2025
- Pathology
 - 10% of work is out-of-county (15% in 2023)
 - Out-of-county cases have also trended downward, but we expect to add Riley County cases sometime this year
 - Suicides cases have stabilized (11%)
 - Overdose cases have decreased slightly from 2022
 - Overdoses accounted for 19% of the caseload (2024)
 - 64% of overdose cases involve detection of fentanyl
- Toxicology
 - o Backlog
 - Toxicology backlog (15) is now more manageable (vs. 109 in April 2024)
 - HPT/DUI backlog cases have decreased from 2024, and the number of submissions remain stable from 2024
- Drug Identification
 - o Backlog (495) is directly related to staffing challenges and training
 - Number of cases submitted has decreased; some cases still going to KBI
 - o Drug ID fentanyl positive exhibits
 - Monthly averages are comparable, if not slightly higher, than 2024 but more cases are being processed this year vs. last
- Fire Debris
 - Training was completed in 2024 and testing is currently underway
 - 2 cases received to date in 2025 no significant backlog
- Firearms
 - Have 2 fully-trained Firearms Examiners in-house
 - Firearms backlog (5) is a function of submission volume and in-house reviews
 - 174 firearms cases submitted in 2024 (twice as many cases per month as compared to 2022)
 - o 62 firearms cases submitted to date in 2025
- Biology/DNA
 - Biology/DNA backlog (2) has decreased significantly
 - Biology/DNA case submissions have remained stable 66 so far in 2025
 - Engaging with WPD about lower burglary submissions and could discuss

accepting more SAEKs here.

Quarterly Summary

- Number of deaths reported remaining stable, number of Coroner cases down slightly
- Both LC-MS/MS instrument validations continuing and we have exhausted Coverdell funded outsourcing for Tox
- Completed an RFP for QTOF instrument (Tox), expect installation in approximately 1 year
- CIP space study and cost estimate complete legacy renovations for the Central Building have been submitted to facilities
- Staffing has remained fairly stable attribute to compensation

OD2A Grant

- OD2A funded position is testing drugs and paraphernalia from scenes, as well as other illicit drug casework
- Medical Investigations have collected drugs and/or paraphernalia at 138 scenes since starting the project December 1, 2023
- Drug paraphernalia testing is caught up (822 items)
- Began data sharing with CDC as pilot for developing data coding processes now all participants are sharing data
- Starting to track results by matrix
- Hoping to report drugs with co-occurrence

2024 Grants Submitted

- 2024 Coverdell Formula (\$99,900) award ending
- 2025 Coverdell Formula (\$78,619) award notice received
- CEBR (\$294,461) program underway
- JAG (\$39,721) program underway
- OD2A Local (\$250,000) carry-over spending underway

New or Renewed in 2025

- OD2A Local Year 2 (\$250,000) program underway
- KDHE OD2A (\$64,158) renewed agreement executed

2025 Budget

- No decision packages presented this year
- Asked for some additional funding for chemistry instrument maintenance

CIP Requests

 DNA Addition - proposed moving additional disciplines to a second sit in close proximity to central building - renovation of central building for pathology and toxicology
