On the recommendation of Joe Thomas, on behalf of Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP), Anna Meyerhoff-Cole moved to **accept the Change Order from ABeam Consulting (USA) Ltd. to extend the term of the agreement through December 31, 2026 and establish additional cost billed on a time and materials basis at the rates shown above.** Philip Davolt seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

ABeam Consulting (USA) Ltd. is the consulting firm providing support services for the migration from county's SAP ECC 6.0 to SAP S/4 HANA, Private Cloud Edition, and SAP Ariba Snap. The planned post go-live support was not enough and supplemental support from this consulting service is required.

The original contract is for \$2,491,998.00 and project completion date of December 31, 2025. Cumulative total for Change Orders 1 and 2 will be based on total of services provided and an additional 12 months of supplemental support.

Increase in contract spend of \$49,000.00 and supplemental support extended through March 31, 2026.

Tania Cole: My only question here is Change Order #1 says Increase in contract spend of \$49,000.00 and supplemental support extended through March 31, 2026. So in this change order number two, we're getting some additional support.

Joe Thomas: Yes. We're picking up at April 1st through to December 31st.

Brandi Baily: Do we know about how much more we're looking at potentially?

Joe Thomas: No and that's why we have the rates because it's not a known quantity. On the recommendation of Britt Rosencutter, on behalf of Regional Forensic Science Center, Brandi Baily moved to **accept the quote from QIAGEN LLC in the amount of \$144,147.77**. Tim Myers seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

The United States Department of Justice, National Institute of Justice recommends that laboratories incorporate robotics and/or automation at each step of the DNA process for the most efficient high-throughput approach. As such, RFSC used DNA Capacity Enhancement for Backlog Reduction (CEBR) funding to acquire and implement a robotic DNA workflow.

This equipment vastly increased the laboratory's capability to screen sexual assault kits and facilitated more sensitive methods for the detection of male DNA. Since implementation, grant funding has been used to support required maintenance agreements in order to comply with accreditation standards and the FBI Quality Assurance Standards. RFSC plans to continue to fund the maintenance with grant funding, if available.

The instruments are serviced by the manufacturer (QIAGEN) and the consumables required to operate the instrumentation are available only through QIAGEN.

Notes:

Previous spend was \$19,410.00 per year for 2022-2027 (5 year total \$97,050.00).

The new pricing is based on 2027 list pricing, which is consistent with ~8% increase per year during 2022-2027, had the 2022 list pricing not been locked-in.

The 2027-2028 pricing has some instruments prorated to align all service periods to October 1st through September 30th annually.

Questions and Answers

Brandi Baily: Is this annual maintenance just for one (1) year but you said previous bid was only \$19,000.00 for each year?

Shelly Steadman: So it was previously \$19,410.00 for all five (5) instruments per year. That is now going up to approximately \$28,805.00 per year for all five (5) instruments each year. This will be a five (5) year agreement.

Brandi Baily: Okay, that's what I was missing.

On the recommendation of Britt Rosencutter, on behalf of Environmental Resources, Anna Meyerhoff-Cole moved to **accept the proposal from Dynamic Lifecycle Innovations, Inc. dba Dynamic Lifecycle Innovations (Dynamic) in the amount of \$177,550.00 and a collection rate of \$0.22 per pound for the duration of the event.** Philip Davolt seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

A review committee comprised of Susan Erlenwein and Catherine Johnson - Environmental Resources; Jerry Martin - Public Works; and Britt Rosencutter - Purchasing reviewed and scored the responses based on criteria set forth in the RFP. The committee unanimously agreed to accept the proposal from Dynamic Lifecycle Innovations, Inc. dba Dynamic Lifecycle Innovations.

This event will be held on two (2) weekends (Thursdays through Saturdays from April 25, 2026 to May 2, 2026) at the Public Works' West Yard. The awarded vendor is responsible for equipment and staffing to facilitate event days to include: collection of materials from customer vehicles, weighing and tracking materials collected for reporting back to the county, loading material onto trucks for transport back to their facility, and event site preparation/clean-up. The vendor will recycle all material collected through appropriate domestic recycling facilities following laws and standards that govern recycling. The vendor will also shred/drill all hard drives received during the event.

The last event was conducted over two (2) consecutive weekends in April of 2024. That event resulted in 418,617 lbs. of E-waste material collected.

Notes:

Dynamic is the vendor used for the last event in 2024. The lump sum from 2024 was \$161,400.00. The per pound collected material charge in 2024 was \$0.22.

Better Hauling Company dba 1-800-JUNKPRO, LLC (Better Hauling) had the lower price but scored lower on the evaluation. Better Hauling's scope of work had less information regarding the recycling performance standards. The recycling performance and proper handling of the electronics after collection is very important. Better Hauling uses a third party for recycling electronics and that is a concern. Environmental Resources is uncomfortable outsourcing this part of the process as it requires strict adherence to environmental regulations. In addition, Better Hauling's relevant experience section was lacking detail.

Questions and Answers

Brandi Baily: At this event, is there a limit on how many people can drop off so the pounds don't increase so much because maybe there's a business dropping off a lot of E-waste material?

Catherine Johnson: There is not a limit. Some years we have more vehicles that come but maybe not more pounds of waste. Some electronics are getting smaller over time especially televisions. We used to have a huge weight of televisions because they were giant. As electronics get smaller, the weight does tend to go down. But to your question, there's not a limit per vehicle.

Philip Davolt: Just for the record, Better Hauling's proposal just wasn't bid well?

Catherine Johnson: It was not as detailed as to exactly how the work would be carried out and then also they have a partnership. Better Hauling is through Junk Pro is doing the on-site facilitation and then working with IT Source to do the actual recycling of the electronics. The committee felt this is really sensitive information that is on many of these devices. To just have one (1) company doing all of it feels more secure. Dynamic also has a lot of certifications as far as environmental standards, seems very trustworthy. As they mentioned in their proposal, they have done the last four (4) of these events for the county so they have served us well in the past and built trust.

Tania Cole: So Dynamics is taking it from you and then taking it to the very end?

Catherine Johnson: Correct. They take it to their facility and dismantle, refurbish, destroy, shred, or whatever depending on the item.

Tim Myers: It looks like the price per pound is the same as it was in 2024?

Catherine Johnson: Correct.

On the recommendation of Britt Rosencutter, on behalf of the Department of Corrections, Tim Myers moved to **accept the proposals and execute service provider agreements with Masters and Mentors: Youth Enrichment Strategies (YES), Inc. in the amount of \$198,000.00, Mental Health America of South Central Kansas, Inc. in the amount of \$170,000.00, and Prime Fit Youth Foundation in the amount of \$200,000.00 for a term of 18 months, beginning January 1, 2026 and ending June 30, 2027.** Anna Meyerhoff-Cole seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

A committee comprised of Lesa Lank, Julee Meslin, Alex Allbaugh, and Nicholl'e Briggs - Department of Corrections; Kenneth Phillips - Division of Finance; Dr. Delores Craig-Moreland, PhD - Wichita State University School of Criminal Justice; and Britt Rosencutter - Purchasing evaluated all proposal responses based on the criteria set forth in the RFP. The committee unanimously agreed to accept the proposals as stated above.

The Kansas Department of Corrections (KDOC) Evidence-Based Programs Funding utilizes current research to deliver evidence-based programming and practices for juvenile offenders, juveniles experiencing mental health crisis and their families by community supervision offices including, but not limited to: juvenile intake and assessment, court services, community corrections, and juvenile crisis intervention centers. These services are intended to support positive youth development and promote improved educational outcomes for youth.

This initiative is grounded in the Juvenile Justice Reform Bill enacted in 2016, which restructured the state's approach to serving justice-involved youth by emphasizing prevention, accountability, and evidence-based intervention. As a key component of this reform, the Evidence-Based Programs Fund was established to reinvest resources into community-based programs and practices demonstrated to reduce recidivism and improve long-term outcomes for youth.

The proposal request from Masters and Mentors for \$213,206.95 was selected and funded at \$198,000.00 to provide mentorship, life skills, and cognitive training to justice involved and high risk youth, ages 12-18. The proposal request from Mental Health America of South Central Kansas for \$197,628.00 was selected and funded at \$170,000.00 to provide Paths to Resilience, an intensive intervention service to reduce use of alcohol and substances, and violence. This program will increase personal and social skills to promote healthy behaviors targeting moderate to high risk youth, ages 6-18. The proposal request from Prime Fit Youth Foundation for \$267,750.00 was selected and funded at \$200,000.00 to provide evidence-based community and school embedded intervention services targeting moderate and high-risk youth, ages 10-17. The other proposals were not chosen for funding at this time.

Questions and Answers

Anna Meyerhoff-Cole: Do we offer any of the selected programs currently?

Mario Salinas: We do not currently offer any contracts for the current programs.

Tim Myers: Is this funded by grants?

Mario Salinas: Yes. This is funded through the Kansas Department of Corrections Evidence-Based Practice Fund.

Tania Cole: I see that each vendor, they're very specific in what they're offering for programs. None of them overlap. Is this something that Corrections puts out for to say we want these programs and then the vendor says, okay, these are the programs I can offer? Is that how that's being submitted or how that works with these vendors?

Mario Salinas: No. Really it's the Evidence-Based Practice Funds that has criteria that's allowable for these proposals and then we put that RFP out here at the local level and the group that scores them identifies what the needs are for our community and the youth that we serve.

Philip Davolt: To my own benefit, when one's awarded an amount that's less than what they proposed, do they just provide 80% of that or do they agree to do that for what we've awarded them?

Mario Salinas: The original term was to begin in January so we made some adjustments based off of the time frame and the time it's going to allow once the contracts get completed. Then some of the proposals also are going to serve outside of that criteria that's allowable so we adjusted the amount so we could fund more of the programs and then also coordinated with those providers to ensure that they were willing to continue to serve those projected numbers of youth.
