CLEARWATER FIRE RESPONSE

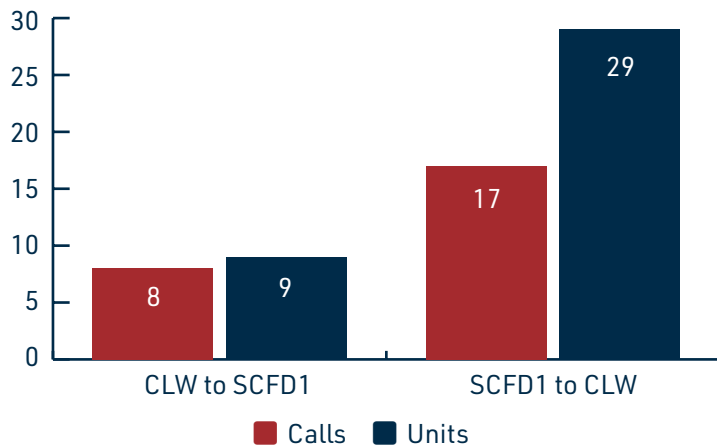
The Clearwater Fire Department (CLW) is a volunteer department that operates on a paging/on-call system. CLW provides services to the City of Clearwater and to the township of Ninnescah.

MUTUAL/AUTO AID DATA SUMMARY

The red boxes in the graph below show only dispatch data for calls that fall within the respective Mutual/Auto Aid agreement between January 2024 and September 2025. Information in the blue boxes represent total response units that fall **within** the aid agreements.

SCFD1 responded to 1 boundary response and 3 dispatching errors.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL RESPONSE

According to the NFPA, in 2023 approximately 67% of fire department calls in the United States were medical in nature. Given this volume, providing adequate medical response is a critical component for any fire department.

A prime example is the response to cardiac arrest. SCFD1 employs the Pit Crew Model (see right), which requires a minimum of 4 fire department personnel and 2 EMS personnel. **Failure to meet these personnel requirements significantly reduces resuscitation effort.**

WHAT CLEARWATER RESIDENTS CURRENTLY PAY FOR FIRE SERVICE

The median home value in Clearwater is estimated at \$190,000 and the total mill for levy for the fire department is estimated to be 12.287. Using the 2025 mill levy formula (see below), a resident with a \$190,000 home would be estimated to be paying \$268.47 a year for fire service from the Clearwater Fire Department.

Appraised Value (Dollars) **X** Residential Assessment Rate (Percentage) **X** Tax Levy Mill Rate (Mills/1000) **=** Taxes Due

EXAMPLE: \$190,000 x 11.5% x 0.012287 = \$268.47 Taxes Due

COST FOR FIRE SERVICE WITHIN SEDGWICK COUNTY FIRE DISTRICT NUMBER 1

The current mill levy for SCFD1 is 16.750. Using the same formula as the previous page, a \$190,000 home in Clearwater would pay \$365.99 a year for fire service. This would be an increase of \$97.52 a year, or \$8.13 a month.

Appraised Value (Dollars) **X** Residential Assessment Rate (Percentage) **X** Tax Levy Mill Rate (Mills/1000) **=** Taxes Due

EXAMPLE: \$190,000 x 11.5% x 0.016750 = \$365.99 Taxes Due

Fire Response

When large-scale emergencies strike, we coordinate with nearby departments to provide support across the regions. SCFD1 serves as the Regional Response Team for the State Fire Marshal for both Hazmat and Technical Rescue.

Community Risk Reduction

The best way to stop a fire is before it happens. SCFD1's prevention division provides education, code enforcement and training to improve the overall safety of our communities.

- Plan Reviews and Building Inspections
- Hydrant Inspections
- Professional Fire Investigations
- Youth Fire Safety Intervention Resources and Education (Y-Fire)
- Community Education and Outreach Programs
- Smoke Alarm Program

ISO RATINGS

The Insurance Services Organization (ISO) Property Protection Class (PPC) program assesses fire-protection efforts throughout the United States and assigns a classification from 1 (superior fire protection) to 10 (doesn't meet minimum criteria). This classification is a proven and reliable predictor of future fire losses and is used by insurance companies to establish fair premiums for fire insurance – generally offering lower premiums in communities with better protection.

SCFD1 ISO RATING: 2

CLEARWATER ISO RATING: 4

If Clearwater joins the Fire District, ISO ratings may improve for some properties in Western Ninnescah Township and for properties within a 4 mile section of SCFD1 between 103rd W and 119th W, from 93rd S to 119th S.
